Did you know that Alzheimer's Disease is the 6th leading cause of death in the US? 5.4 million people are living with the disease and another American develops the disease every 69 seconds? These outreach specialists spoke recently at a Pastoral Care meeting and have information to share with all of us. They are both employed by the Alzheimer's Association of Wisconsin.

Protecting our children means being informed. Today, January 22 marks the 39th anniversary of the tragic Roe vs. Wade decision which legalized abortion on-demand. Since that day, 53 million unborn children have had their lives brutally and abruptly ended in their mother's womb. Millions of women have been irreparably injured and families left incomplete.
